## WELCOME

*“Hear this, all ye people; give ear, all ye inhabitants of the world” (Psalm 49:1).*

Welcome to the 2010 LLC Minneapolis Summer Services and Annual Meeting! The Minneapolis Laestadian Lutheran Church, along with the sister congregations of Rockford, Elk River, and Cokato, are hosts to these services.

The Psalm writer begins Chapter 49 with words of exhortation: “Hear this, all ye people; give ear, all ye inhabitants of the world” (Ps. 49:1). Even in our time the call goes forth to all people to “give ear” and listen. Apostle Paul has also written: “So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. But I say, Have they not heard? Yes verily, their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world” (Rom. 10:17–18).

The resurrected Jesus appeared to His disciples giving the mission command: “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations” (Matt. 28:19). God’s Word sounds forth today with the gospel message of Jesus Christ, who died for the sins of all people. The Summer Services logo depicts the good tidings of our Savior as sound waves emanating from the symbol of the cross. The logo also includes the motto text and is surrounded by an oval shape representing the world. Modern technology has helped the Living Word to reach the far corners of the world, and the gospel of forgiveness is freely offered to all who desire to hear it and believe.

At these festive services may the gospel message of salvation in Jesus Christ sound clearly to cleanse the seeking one from all sin and to renew the hope of heaven for each one who believes. In Psalm 49, the writer reminds that our focus should be on eternal life rather than personal glory or temporal riches. During recent times of economic uncertainty, comfort is also found in the words of Jesus: “But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you” (Matt. 6:33).

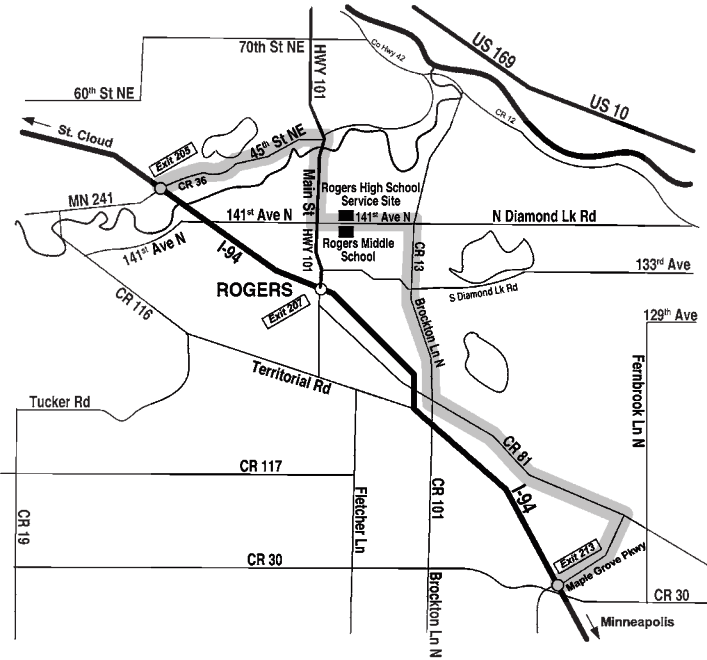

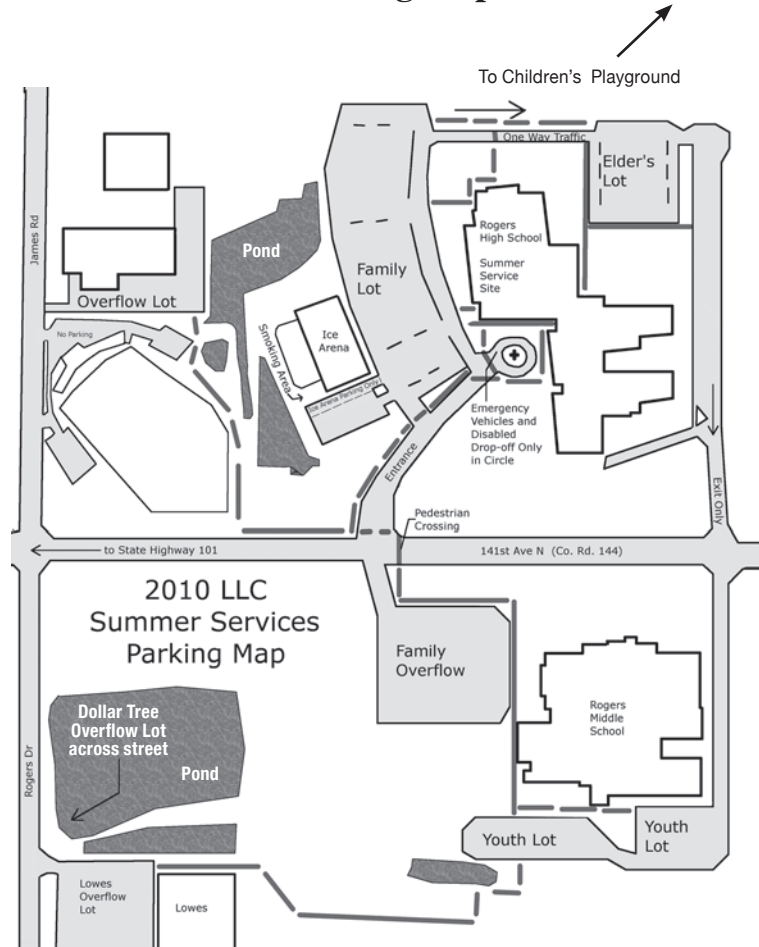

# Rogers, Minnesota Area Map

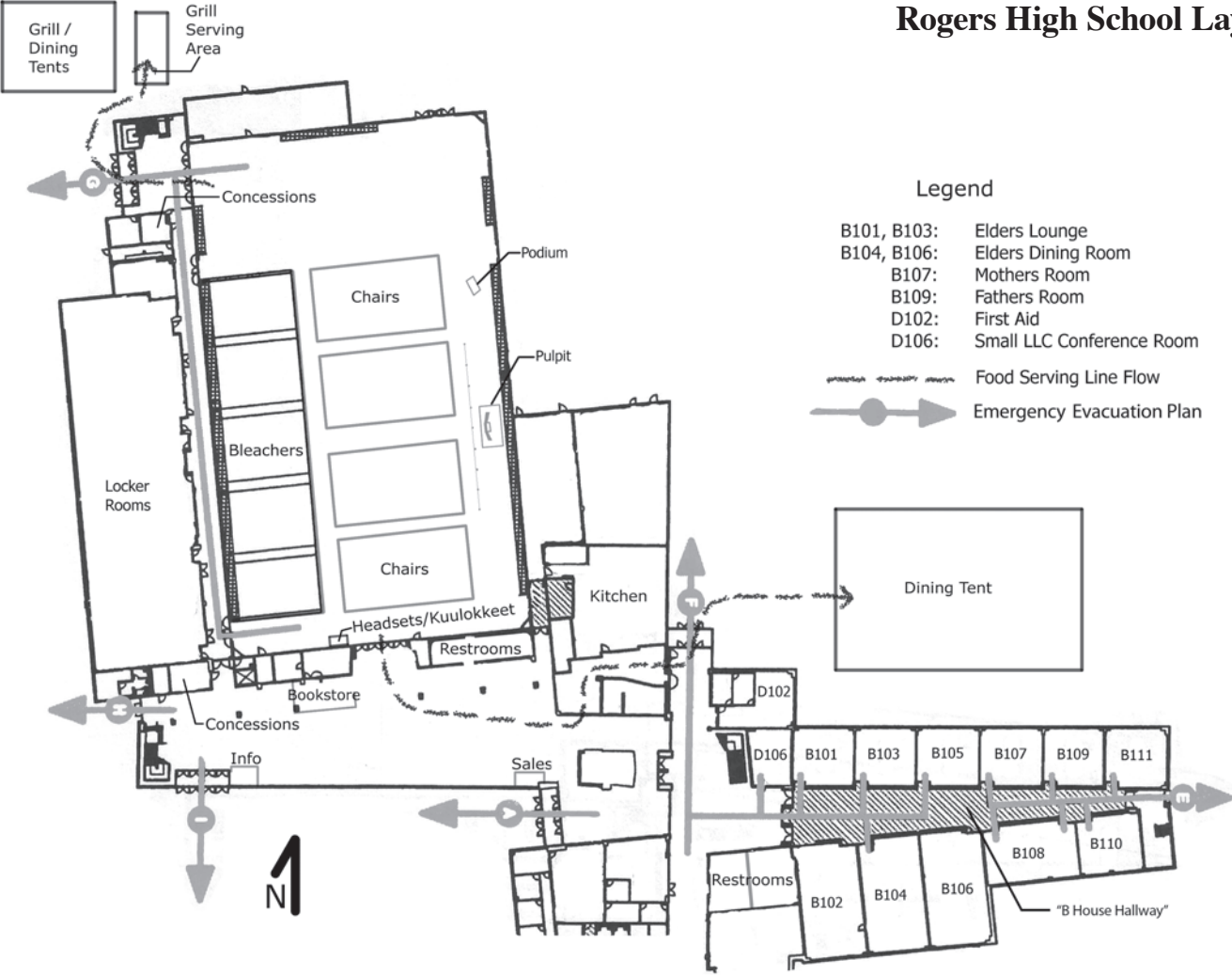
Alternate Routes to Service Site

# Parking Map

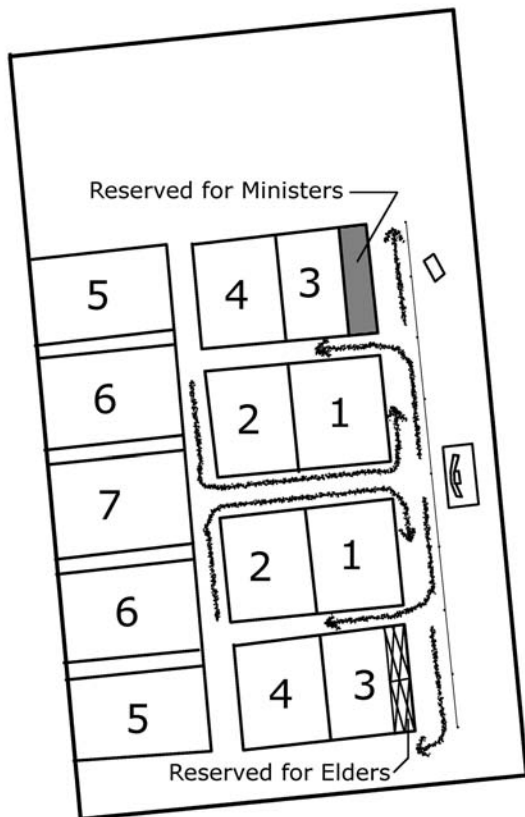


# Rogers High School Layout

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Planning Committee provides the following information to help better serve your needs as a service guest. There is an Information Booth just inside the main entrance. Anyone with special questions or needs or anyone who needs assistance with a lost child may contact the Information Booth.

*Complimentary ID wristbands are available for children at the Information Booth.*

### FIRST AID/EMERGENCY

The First Aid room is located near the entrance to the "B House Hallway" (Room D102). There will be signage directing you to this area. In addition, please see the school map, pages 10–11. A qualified healthcare professional will be on duty at all times during the services for First Aid needs. For any medical issues beyond basic First Aid, the First Aid Room will have maps and directions to local clinics, urgent care facilities, hospitals, and pharmacies.

### FOOD SERVICE

Meal tickets are available for sale at the Sales Tables and Information Booth located near the main entrance, or from sales persons near the outdoor grill area. Ticket prices are as follows: \$5/individual for any meal, \$25/family (including children through 15 years of age) for any meal, \$3/individual outdoor grill meat ala carte. Meal reservations are not required.

Meals will be served from the cafeteria and also at the covered grill area north of the school. If desired, elders will be able to enjoy meals in the Elders Dining Room located in the "B House Hallway." Please see the school map, pages 10–11.

Meal options are as follows:

- Hamburger, cheeseburger, or pork chop, baked beans or fresh vegetable, chips and beverage  
(Hamburger, cheeseburger, or pork chop only, \$3.00 each)

### **Pizza Stand (served in cafeteria):**

- Two slices of Pizza Hut™ pizza (choice of pepperoni, sausage, or cheese) with fresh vegetable and beverage  
Hours: Thursday (4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.), Friday/Saturday (11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.), Sunday (11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.)  
(Pizza will be available for sale during youth activities: \$3/large slice of pizza or \$4/large slice of pizza including beverage.)

### **Deli/Lunch (served in cafeteria):**

- Chicken salad croissant with chips, fresh vegetable, and beverage, or
- Chef salad (spring mix, cucumber, tomato, hard-boiled egg, shredded cheese, sliced ham and turkey) with breadstick, fresh fruit, and beverage  
Hours: Friday, Saturday, and Sunday (11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.)

### **Supper (served in cafeteria):**

## **PARKING/USHERING**

Please drive safely at all times and obey traffic laws and posted speed limits.

**Parking:** Parking attendants will be on hand to help with parking. Please observe parking signs, handicapped parking signs, and directions given by the parking lot attendants. If the main parking lots are full, follow the signs to overflow lots staffed by attendants who will shuttle you to services. For those parking in the family overflow lot and youth lots, there is only one place to safely cross CR 144. This crosswalk will be well marked and staffed at all times by parking lot attendants. Please note CR 144 has a speed limit of 50 mph. Please see the Parking Map, page 9.

**Ushering:** Ushers wearing black armbands will be on duty during services.

## **COMMUNION**

The Communion Service will be on Saturday evening at 6:00 p.m. Communion guests will approach the Communion altar coming up the middle aisle and leaving from the sides. Ushers will be releasing specific sections of seating at a time. Please remain seated until you are released to be served at the altar. There will also be other ushers positioned throughout the Service areas to ensure a smooth flow and to ensure that all guests are able to come to Communion. A designated reserved area will be arranged in the main gym for those persons to be served Communion who are unable to wait in line. Communion will also be served in the Elders Lounge for those elders who wish to be served there.
